

Discussion Questions Jesus' Cares: Week Four

What are some ideas about "truth" floating around our world today?
Why do you think so many people question "truth" in our world?
What are some inherent problems with believing there is no (God) or absolute truth?

In the Scriptures, Jesus is described as "the truth," and we are called to "know" the truth. How does this idea of truth go beyond just information or rules?

One of the realities of truth is that it demands obedience. How do you see this play out very practically in the physical world? How does this idea relate to Jesus being the truth?

In John 8:31-32 Jesus says, "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. 32 Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

In these verses, Jesus lays out a relationship between obedience, truth & freedom. What is the relationship between the three? How does obedience to truth help us to "know" that truth more? How does obedience to "the truth" lead to freedom?

What does our world mean when it talks about freedom? How is this different from what the Bible means by freedom?
In John 14:6, Jesus says, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." What is Jesus saying here?
What else from the message this week stuck out to you?
