

## Discussion Questions Jesus & The Ten Commandments Week 4: Remember the Sabbath

- 1. What is your experience with people observing the Sabbath?
- 2. \*Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.

  What do you think this word means by "holy?" What do you think God looks for His people on a Sabbath day?
- 3. <sup>9</sup> Six days you shall labor and do all your work, <sup>10</sup> but the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God.

Are you tempted to make work or rest/relaxation an idol?

4. Pastor Dave talked about Sabbath (ing) to the Lord your God, being, in part, about trusting him.

Read Matthew 6:25-34.

How does the 4th commandment help us trust the Lord and not worry about our lives?

- 5. We also discussed Sabbath as a chance to step away from other possible Lords. Phones, hobbies, habits.... How does/might this practice keep God as God in your life?
- 6. On it, you shall not do any work,

The Jews in Jesus' day had gotten very legalistic about what was and wasn't work. How is this missing the point of the Sabbath?

How does what Jesus say in Mark 2:27 apply to this?

- neither you, nor your son or daughter, nor your male or female servant, nor your animals, nor any foreigner residing in your towns.
   How does our ability (or inability) to turn work off impact other people in our lives?
   Do you have any (positive or negative) examples of this?
- 8. <sup>11</sup> For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but he rested on the seventh day.
  What did God's rest on the 7th day involve, and how does that shape our understanding of what a Sabbath is all about?
- 9. Therefore the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy.
  Pastor Dave challenged us this week to not have a Sabbath rhythm without a Sabbath Lord.

Read Matthew 11:28-30

Why is connecting with and relying on Jesus at the center of our Sabbath so critical?
